Something I continue to see is students with untied shoes. This is not only a tripping hazard throughout the day, but also a safety issue for those who are bike riders.



I always tie my shoe laces properly - I don't want them getting caught in my pedals when I'm riding!

Halloween is in a few weeks and as we prepare please keep safety in mind. Ensure children's costumes are fire-resistant. Use make-up if possible, as opposed to a mask, in order to not obscure vision. If children are allowed out after dark, fasten reflective tape to their costumes and bags, or give them glow sticks. A responsible adult should accompany young children on the neighborhood rounds. If your older children are going alone, plan and review a route acceptable to you. Agree on a specific time children should return home. Teach your children never to enter a stranger's home or car. Instruct your children to travel only in familiar, well-lit areas and stick with their friends. Tell your children not to eat any treats until they return home, and an adult has inspected all their goodies. Children and adults are reminded to put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.

Here's a scary statistic: Children are more than twice as likely to be hit by a car and killed on Halloween than on any other day of the year.

Lack of visibility because of low lighting at night also plays a factor in these incidents.

Did you know?

You can report crimes or other suspicious activity anonymously through the Santa Rosa SpeakOut app or calling 850-437-STOP.

FORTIFYFL is another reporting app, allowing you to instantly relay info to law enforcement agencies and school officials.
