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East Bay K – 8 School
School Advisory Council
August 26, 2021

Beth Mosley, principal, called the meeting to order at 7:38 a.m. The following handouts were distributed: Agenda, Staff; Student, Parent/Family School Compact Agreement, 2021-22; SAC Draft Bylaws; Screenshot of SIP Focus Areas; notes from the Summer Leadership Meeting in June.

In attendance were Beth Mosley, Trish Johnson, Alison Keegan, Jen Sevilla, Rebecca Webster, Katie Stein, Debbie Stanhagen, Amy Chamberlin, Gretchen Clarke, Leah Cortello, Chrissy Flanigan, Dana McKnight, Lindsey Polk & Tiffany Spooner.

Mrs. Mosley discussed the purpose of the SAC, input of the School Improvement Plan (SIP) and the September 9th meeting to approve our school's SIP.

Nominations for Chairperson and Vice Chairperson were opened to the floor; Debbie Stanhagen made a motion to approve Alison Keegan as Chairperson and Lindsey Polk as Vice Chairperson; Tiffany Spooner seconded; with all in favor, motion passed.

Mrs. Mosley presented the draft Bylaws to the members with time to review and appointed Debbie Stanhagen as SAC secretary. Rebecca Webster made a motion to approve the draft bylaws as is; Jen Sevilla seconded; with all in favor, motion passed. Bylaws adopted as written and provided to the council members.

The Title I School Compact Agreement for 2021-22 was reviewed and discussed. Denise McKnight made a motion to approve the compact as written; Chrissy Flanigan seconded; with all in favor, motion passed. Compact approved for distribution to all parents.

Mrs. Mosley updated the council on Title I Parents' Right to Know, SPAR, Parent Resource Center, Complaint Process of NCLB.

Mrs. Mosley discussed the SIP Focus Areas, 2 to select; handout provided, members reviewed. The council decided to focus on Positive Behavior Intervention & Supports and Leadership Development as East Bay's 2 Areas of Focus in the SIP.

Mrs. Mosley informed the council on student enrollment; at 80% capacity with ~605 elementary students and ~298 middle schoolers. Additional teachers may be approved to hire in grades K, 1, 3 & 4.

The Vision and Mission statements, school motto and defining words for L.E.A.D.S. were presented to and reviewed by the council. Details provided on the Summer Leadership handout.

Campus Safety and the district's new covid mitigation protocols were discussed. East Bay has 83 cameras, an SRO, all doors locked with badge access only; additional bullet-proof glass to be installed on the interior lobby doors that lead to the hub. East Bay has had 2 successful combination lockdown/fire drills; this type of drill will occur monthly.

Mrs. Mosley reported on 2 student clubs East Bay will establish; Jr. Optimist Club and the Junior National Honor Society, emphasizing the Jr. Optimist club's focus on service, not fundraising, and membership to JNHS to include consideration of citizenship as well as academics.

After further discussion, the members suggested a "buddy" system, as covid protocols allow, for middle school students to offer academic support to the younger students; suggestion tabled for further discussion post covid outbreak surge.

Mrs. Mosley reported on the funding of the School Improvement Plan, there are no SIP funds at our cost center to date; she also discussed the school's Operating & Title I budgets.

Additional questions and comments were taken from the council members.

Future meeting dates, as listed on the agenda, are 9/9 (SIP approval), 11/16, 2/10 and 4/28, (Title I input).
